## CONVOCATION <br> OF THE $123^{\text {rd }}$ ASSEMBLY OF THE INTER-PARLAMENTARYUNION

Madam President, Mr. President,

It is our pleasure to inform you that the $123^{\text {rd }}$ Assembly of the Inter-Parliamentary Union and related meetings will be held at the Centre international de Conférences de Genève (CICG), Geneva (Switzerland) from Monday, 4 to Wednesday, 6 October 2010.

## 1. AGENDA

1. Election of the President and Vice-Presidents of the $123^{\text {rd }}$ Assembly
2. Consideration of possible requests for the inclusion of an emergency item in the Assembly agenda
3. Panel discussions on:
(a) Preventing electoral violence and ensuring the smooth transition of power (First Standing Committee on Peace and International Security)
(b) Management of natural resources, agricultural production and demographic change (Second Standing Committee on Sustainable Development, Finance and Trade)
(c) Transparency and accountability in political party funding (Third Standing Committee on Democracy and Human Rights)
4. Report of the IPU Committee on United Nations Affairs
5. Amendments to the Statutes and Rules of the IPU

## 2. PANEL DISCUSSIONS

On Tuesday, 5 October, three panel discussions will take place on the subject items of the Standing Committees that have been included in the agenda of the $124^{\text {th }}$ Assembly.

The format and conduct of these panel discussions will be largely informal, with focus on debate and interaction. They will be moderated by two or more experts. The co-Rapporteurs will also make very brief (maximum five minutes) introductions of their draft report.

The aim of these panel discussions is to raise awareness of IPU Members of the subjects included in the agenda of the $124^{\text {th }}$ Assembly. There will be no negotiations as such and all prepared speeches setting out formal positions are highly discouraged.

The panel discussions also offer the participants an opportunity to provide comments and suggestions on the preliminary draft reports that have been prepared by the co-Rapporteurs. This will provide the co-Rapporteurs with an intermediary checkpoint halfway through the drafting process and help them to enrich their reports and recommendations.
Also on Tuesday, 5 October, there will be a special event on Migration and Development. The event will take the form of an informal panel discussion and will serve several purposes.
It will provide an opportunity for Members to share information on action they have taken to follow up the resolutions they adopted in 2005 and 2008.
Participants will also be informed of major developments related to migration, including preparations for the Fourth Global Forum on Migration and Development, new aspects of migration and proposals on migration governance.

## 3. TIMETABLE *

The timetable of the Assembly is set out in Annex I. The closing sitting of the $123{ }^{\text {rd }}$ Assembly will take place on Wednesday, 6 October, from $\mathbf{4}$ p.m. to 5.30 p.m. During this sitting, the report on the possible emergency item included in the Assembly agenda will be presented and the draft resolution submitted for adoption. Delegations are kindly requested to bear this in mind when making their travel arrangements.

## 4. EMERGENCY ITEM

According to Assembly Rule 11 and Article 14.2 of the Statutes, any Member of the Union may request the inclusion of an emergency item in the Assembly agenda. If the Assembly decides to include an emergency item in its agenda, this will be debated by the Assembly on Monday, 4 October 2010. Provision has also been made on the following day for a possible meeting of a drafting committee to prepare a draft resolution.

## 5. PARTICIPATION

Each IPU Member may appoint a maximum of five delegates to the second annual session of the Assembly, or seven for parliaments of countries with a population of 100 million inhabitants or more. Any delegation that, for three consecutive sessions of the Assembly, is composed exclusively of parliamentarians of the same sex, shall, however, automatically be reduced by one person.

[^0]Please note that the number of additional MPs accompanying delegations as Advisers must not exceed two.

IPU Members whose arrears equal or exceed the amount of the contributions due from them for the preceding two full years may not be represented by more than two delegates at meetings of the Union (Article 5.2 of the Statutes).

Associate Members may participate in the Assembly and its Standing Committees with the same rights as Members, save for the right to vote and to present candidates for elective office.

International organizations and other bodies invited by the Governing Council to be represented at the Assembly as observers are entitled to send a maximum of two delegates.

## 6. STEERING COMMITTEE

The Steering Committee of the Assembly shall be composed of the President of the Assembly, the President of the Inter-Parliamentary Union and the Vice-President of the Executive Committee. The Presidents of the Standing Committees may take part in its work in an advisory capacity.
The Steering Committee, assisted by the IPU Secretary General, is mandated to take all appropriate measures to ensure the effective organization and normal functioning of the Assembly proceedings.

## 7. TABLE SHOWING THE ALLOCATION OF VOTES

A provisional table showing the votes allocated to delegations at the $123^{\text {rd }}$ Assembly is contained in Annex II.

Members are kindly requested to check the figures concerning them and, if necessary, inform in writing the IPU Secretariat in Geneva of any modifications required, preferably in advance. The final table showing the allocation of votes at the Assembly will be distributed at the opening of the session.

## 8. LANGUAGES

The Secretariat of the Inter-Parliamentary Union will provide simultaneous interpretation into and from the two official languages of the Union: English and French, as well as Arabic and Spanish, at the meetings of all statutory bodies.
Three other interpretation channels have been reserved for Chinese, Japanese and Russian at sittings of the Assembly, the Governing Council, and for the Panel discussions.
Delegates may, exceptionally, use another language provided that they arrange for their speech to be interpreted into one of the IPU's official languages, and that copies of the speech be given to the Chief Interpreter (Ms. F. Steinig-Huang) well in advance and no later than two hours before it is to be delivered.

## 9. MEETINGS OF OTHER BODIES

Other bodies will hold meetings during the Assembly; their members will be convened by way of a separate letter. They include:
$>\quad$ The Governing Council (4 and 6 October, public sittings);
> The Executive Committee ( $1^{\text {st }}, 2$ and 5 October, in camera);
$>$ The Coordinating Committee of Women Parliamentarians (3 October, in camera);
> The Gender Partnership Group (2 October, in camera);
$>$ The Committee on the Human Rights of Parliamentarians (2, 3, 4 and 5 October, in camera);
> The Committee on Middle East Questions (3 October, in camera);
> The IPU Committee on United Nations Affairs (4 and 6 October, public sittings)
The Association of Secretaries General of Parliaments (ASGP) will also meet at the CICG during the Assembly. It will be convened by its President.

## 13. HOTEL ACCOMODATION

Delegations from countries with a Permanent Mission in Geneva are kindly requested to make their hotel reservations through their respective Mission. The Permanent Missions in Geneva are all informed of the holding of the $123^{\text {rd }}$ Assembly and are accustomed to receiving national delegations to United Nations meetings and to handling hotel reservations for them. Many of them have signed agreements and obtained preferential rates with hotels close to the Palais des Nations area and the CICG.

In keeping with the practice of all hotels in Geneva, only reservations made with details of a credit card as a guarantee will be confirmed. Since October is a very busy period for Geneva hotels, it is highly recommended that hotel reservations be made as soon as possible.

## 14. VISAS

Switzerland is an associate member of the Schengen Agreement and is part of the Schengen area. For those persons who require a visa, the Swiss authorities can issue a visa for a maximum stay of three months, which is generally valid for the entire Schengen area.

Schengen regulations impose longer deadlines for the issuance of a visa. That is why delegations are requested to submit their applications before 27 August 2010.

The Swiss authorities will endeavour to process applications as soon as possible but cannot guarantee that visas will be issued in cases of late applications. Your kind attention is drawn to the fact that following the entrance of Switzerland into the Schengen area, visas are no longer delivered upon arrival at Geneva international airport. Any delegations in need of assistance must therefore send their requests as soon as possible, and provide the following details: full name, date and place of birth, nationality, type of national passport and number (date of issue and expiry), date of arrival and flight number.
Please also note that Geneva Airport is located on the Swiss-French border and also has a French entry point. Some flights arriving from Paris or other French airports to Geneva are therefore considered as domestic flights. Delegates travelling via France must therefore also check with the competent French authorities to ascertain whether a French or Schengen visa is required for travel through a French airport en route to Geneva.

We hope that your Parliament will be represented at the $123^{\text {rd }}$ Assembly of the Inter-Parliamentary Union and that the delegation, under your leadership, will take an active part in the proceedings.
