- Appointment of law enforcement officials

PROBLEM/OBSTACLES

- Viewpoints and attitudes of general public
- The root cause (imbalance power relationship between men and women)
- Definition excludes sexual violence
- No differentiation of measures and practices for male and female victims

PROBLEM/OBSTACLES

- A need to file a complaint
- Inadequate coordination
- No responsible unit for treatment and rehabilitation
- No allocation of special budget
- Area of prevention is not included
