Even if the pandemic pushed it a bit to the background we still face a massive climate crisis.

And that's a crisis that becomes harder to fight with every passing day

and we do not have a simple cure - like a vaccine we can use.

There is no planet B!

We have to act now, because the consequences of the climate emergency start to show.

In Austria we start new innovative projects like to establishment an national climate assembly<sup>1</sup>, where 100 randomly but representative chosen people get the chance to help, to shape the Austrian climate politics.
