*Ladies and Gentlemen,*

1. I join other delegates to appreciate and congratulate the IPU for organizing this important forum. Trust-based, people-centered, and result-oriented international cooperation needs to be promoted.
2. The world is indeed at an inflection point characterized by high uncertainty, complexity,

and volatility. Humanity is in danger if we don't take action.

3. Global governance and leadership are in crisis. Multilateralism and the rules-based order are under severe strain, while wars and violations of international law continue unchecked. Women and children are disproportionately affected.
4. Against this alarming trend, it is more urgent than ever that we all should unite to defend the UN Charter and promote open and inclusive multilateralism. And parliamentary diplomacy is becoming more relevant in shaping the evolving, fragmented multipolar world order.
5. As a small state, Cambodia relies on international law and multilateral system to protect its sovereignty and territorial integrity.
6. We applaud the ceasefire declaration mediated by Malaysia on 28 July 2025. We are grateful to Malaysian Prime Minister Anwar Ibrahim for his leadership and for hosting the ceasefire talks.
7. We heartfelt appreciate President Donald Trump for co-organizing the meeting with the active participation of China. We express our deepest gratitude to all international friends for supporting the ceasefire, which save lives and livelihoods of the people of the two nations.

8. I would like to call upon international friends and partners to closely monitor the implementation of the ceasefire, ensuring all parties honor their commitments to completely end the conflict.
9. To prevent the breach of the ceasefire, it is urgent to deploy international observers and inspection team. Please hold accountable those who violate the ceasefire. Fairness and justice are critical.

10. The world already faces enough conflicts; our ASEAN region should avoid adding to the turmoil.
11. Peaceful coexistence, especially between neighbors, is essential. Cambodia is committed to the spirit of good neighborliness and ASEAN Community.
