



Parliaments deliver for rural women and girls

A parliamentary event organized by the Inter-Parliamentary Union and UN Women at the 62nd Session of the Commission on the Status of Women

13 March 2018, Conference Room 3, UN Headquarters, New York

INFORMATION NOTE

During the 62nd Session of the United Nations Commission on the Status of Women (CSW) - whose priority theme is "<u>Challenges and opportunities in achieving gender equality and the empowerment of rural women and girls</u>"-, the Inter-Parliamentary Union (IPU) and UN Women are organising a parliamentary meeting entitled *Parliaments deliver for rural women and girls*.

The meeting will take place on **13 March 2018**, from 10 a.m. to 5.45 p.m. in the Conference Room 3 at UN Headquarters in New York.

Objectives

In keeping with its policy of contributing to major international forums by seeking to introduce a parliamentary dimension into the proceedings of intergovernmental organisations, the IPU is organizing this one-day meeting with UN Women in order to provide a forum for debate between parliamentarians from all over the world, and to contribute to the deliberations of the 62nd CSW.

The event will focus on the paramount role parliaments can play in identifying and addressing obstacles to rural women and girls' empowerment, in ensuring and implementing social and economic policies that will include them in decision-making process at all levels, and in addressing the multiple forms of discrimination that they are facing. The meeting will also explore how to mitigate the impact of climate change on rural women and girls.

Expected outcome

A brief message to the CSW will be issued, stressing areas for future priority action, with particular emphasis on the role of parliaments.

Background documents to be used throughout the meeting include:

- Written contributions of the panellists, when available;
- Documents of the 62nd Session of the CSW, when available.

Participants

The participants in the parliamentary event will include:

- Parliamentarians present in New York for the 62nd Session of the CSW as members of their respective delegations. A letter of invitation will be sent by the IPU Secretary General to all Member and non-member parliaments of the IPU.
- Representatives of governments, relevant organisations and funds of the UN system, and civil society will also be invited.
