



# virtual World e-Parliament Conference 2021



## Provisional programme 18 May 2021

The World e-Parliament Conference takes place from 16 to 18 June 2021. Sessions start daily at **14:00** and end at **18:00 (Geneva, Central European Summer Time)**. The World e-Parliament Conference 2021 will cover five main **themes**:

1. Towards the digital parliament
2. Infrastructure
3. Data in digital parliaments
4. Enabling digital parliamentarians
5. Artificial intelligence

The conference themes will be explored through three **tracks**:

1. Thought leadership: strategic discussions on trends and ideas
2. Peer exchange: exchange of good practices, tips and knowledge on the latest innovations in digital tools and services
3. Co-creation: using participants' collective knowledge to write "quick guides" with practical advice on how to address some of the key issues raised during the conference.

## Notes on the conference themes

The World e-Parliament Conference 2021 will cover five main **themes**:

1. **Towards the digital parliament:** Parliaments have experienced a major acceleration in innovation over the past year. This theme looks at the “big picture”, including lessons learned from the pandemic, the trends in digital transformation strategies, and changing expectations for digital parliaments in the years to come.
2. **Infrastructure:** The management of parliamentary infrastructure is subject to major shifts, driven by both the market and the pandemic. This theme unpacks cloud strategies for parliaments, security considerations for hybrid infrastructures, and planning for business continuity and recovery in emergencies.
3. **Data in digital parliaments:** Data is an essential asset for digital parliaments, providing value for members and the public. This theme provides insights into how parliaments manage their data, the importance of data governance, and pathways towards effective creation and use of open data.
4. **Enabling digital parliamentarians:** Parliamentarians have been using digital tools for years, and 2020 saw another radical leap towards remote working in many parliaments. This theme takes a look at the tools and techniques that parliamentary administrations are developing to serve and support their members.
5. **Artificial intelligence:** This theme discusses a new horizon that many parliaments are beginning to explore. It considers what AI is and how it is being considered in the parliamentary context, with attention to issues of governance and the functions that AI may serve.
