## Speech for Mr. Martin Chungong IPU Secretary General

Science for Peace Parliamentary Meeting: Closing Session

Quy Nhon, 13 September 2023

Excellencies, Distinguished guests, Ladies and gentlemen,

I am very happy to address you today at the closing of this Science for Peace Parliamentary Meeting. As I remarked at the opening of the meeting, this meeting aimed to realize the vision of unity through science for the purpose of peaceful coexistence and act as a platform for dialogue between parliaments on subjects related to the IPU's core objectives. I would like to again convey my sincere gratitude to our partners here at the ICISE, who have welcomed you so warmly in Quy Nhon, and supported the realisation of our common belief in the concept of science for peace. We are grateful to you all for your hard work and dedication in allowing this meeting to happen. I would also like to warmly thank the Qatari Shura Council for their strong and continued support to this joint project, we are honoured to work on these important objectives together.
