The session will include a presentation on the results of the IPU's survey on the institutionalization of the SDGs in the work of parliaments. Delegates will also be given an introduction to the IPU self-assessment toolkit, which has been designed to help parliaments evaluate their readiness to implement the SDGs in their respective countries. Parliamentary representatives will be invited to present their parliament's experience of implementing the SDGs.

Session II: Taking action on climate change and disaster risk reduction and preparedness

This session will follow up on the Paramaribo Declaration and present current trends on climate change and disaster risk reduction in the region. The session will give parliamentarians the opportunity to share and take stock of the progress made at the national level, as well as the challenges and needs related to strengthening parliamentary oversight of government, passing and reviewing appropriate legislation, and properly allocating budgets. Parliamentarians will also be invited to share any innovative approaches by their parliaments to dealing with climate change.

Session III: Health emergencies in the Caribbean region and the role of parliaments in preventing and responding to global health threats

As health emergency preparedness and response are crucial for addressing the consequences of climate change and for building strong and resilient health systems, the session will also discuss how parliaments can engage with health security at the regional and national levels.
