Twelve Plus Group : One vacancy, to be filled by a woman, to replace


Ms. M. Kiener Nellen (Switzerland) who is no longer a Member of Parliament and whose mandate expires in

COMMUNICATION ADDRESSED TO THE SECRETARY GENERAL BY THE PRESIDENT OF THE SWISS INTER-PARLIAMENTARY GROUP

9 January 2020

Swiss seat on the Executive Committee of the Inter-Parliamentary Union

Dear Mr. Secretary General,

On 2 December 2019, Ms. Margret Kiener Nellen ceased to be a member of the Swiss National Council. Consequently, her functions within the Swiss Inter-Parliamentary Group and the Inter-Parliamentary Union (IPU), including those related to the Executive Committee (October 2017–October 2021), have also come to an end.

According to the Statutes and Rules of the IPU, a member of the Swiss Inter-Parliamentary Group can fill the seat for a woman on the Executive Committee held by Switzerland until October 2021, now vacant. Consequently, the Swiss Inter-Parliamentary Group has appointed Ms. Laurence Fehlmann Rielle (Social Democratic Party, Geneva) to complete the mandate begun by Ms. Kiener Nellen.

In addition, Ms. Kiener Nellen's departure means that in April 2020 the Twelve Plus Group will also have to designate a female substitute for the High-Level Advisory Group on Countering Terrorism and Violent Extremism, in accordance with the group's terms of reference.
