
What is Frontex?


- Decentralised EU Agency. Own legal personality and autonomous budget;
- Governed by the Management Board: Heads of EU National Border Management authorities + European Commission;
- Frontex established upon Council Regulation of 26 OCT 2004 and operational as of 3 October 2005;
- Core aim is to support EU Member States by implementing EU policies on Border Management, intelligence-driven;
- **Shared responsibility**: Frontex does not replace national border management systems or responsibilities of the EU Member States;
- New EUROPEAN BORDER AND COAST GUARD AGENCY as of 6 October 2016;








Frontex - Multi-purpose Operational Responses

Hybrid threats at sea is a common challenge

- migration
- Illegal fishing
- drug smuggling
- smuggling of cigarettes
- smuggling of weapons


Frontex - Enhanced cooperation with non-EU Countries
